Because of public health concerns arising from the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic, *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* declared a State of Emergency on March 14, 2020, in Executive Order No. 2020-03. Since then, *I Maga'håga* has issued a series of executive orders to stem the spread of the virus, and the court, in turn, has issued a series of administrative orders limiting and modifying court operations to ensure the protection of the public health. The most recent of such administrative orders, Administrative Order No. ADM20-239 issued on May 4, 2020, included a provision for the reopening of the Northern Court Satellite in Dededo for a limited set of transactions.

In recent weeks, *I Maga'håga* has announced a phased lifting of social restrictions, including the expansion of public operations for certain government of Guam agencies. On May 28, 2020, *I Maga'håga* issued Executive Order No. 2020-16, which, among other things, extends the public health emergency until June 29, 2020, lifts additional social restrictions, and orders the recommencement of public operations for all government of Guam offices, agencies and departments effective June 1, 2020.

In line with the planned reopening of public operations of executive branch agencies of the government of Guam and in recognition of the need to continue to expand the court's services,
