## **About Us**

The Judiciary of Guam is the third branch of the Government of Guam that is charged with interpreting the laws of the U.S. Territory of Guam.

The Judiciary is comprised of the Superior Court of Guam and the Supreme Court of Guam of which both the trial and appellate courts provide for the settlement of disputes between parties and protects the rights of individuals as mandated in the Organic Act of Guam and the Constitution of the United States of America.

The Judicial Council of Guam is the governing body of the Judiciary of Guam-Pursuant to law, it is composed of all full-time Justices of the Supreme Court, the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court, and an appointed Superior Court Judge. The current composition of the Judicial Council was created in 2003, and in 2004, after an amendment to the Organic Act of Guam effectuated by the United States Congress in Public Law 108-378, the judicial branch was declared a separate and co-equal branch of the Government of Guam. Under 48 U.S.C. § 1421-1(b), the Chief Justice of Guam retains all supervisory authority of the judicial branch. With the advice of the Judicial Council, the Chief Justice governs the divisions and offices within the Judiciary of Guam.

## Demographics

## (Population-167, 286 [2019 CIA World Factbook]) As of September 30, 2018, the Superior Court of Guam received 11, 021 filings and the Supreme Court of Guam recorded 65 total case filings. In 2018, the top offenses charged in the Superior Court of Guam were Possession of Schedule II Controlled Substance, Family Violence, Driving While Impaired, Assault-Recklessly Case/Attempt to Cause Bodiy Injury and Special Allegation-Commission of a Felony While on Felony Release. The Supreme Court of Guam issued opinions in 14 civil cases, 13 criminal cases, one certified question and one writ in 2018.

## What's next in 2019

## Adoption of Criminal Justice Automation Commission

Since 1993, the Criminal Justice Automation Commission has guided improvements to the court's case management system, the criminal justice information system, island-wide fingerprinting system, the technologies in Guam patrol cars that link these systems, and a host of other improvements to support the law enforcement needs of our public safety agencies. The ad-hoc commission has continued to operate as the governing body focused on building and strengthening Guam's criminal history records infrastructure. Technology has enlarged the scope of the judiciary's responsibility to preserve the American tradition of open courts. We must have the opportunity to enhance the public's ability to observe and participate in the judicial process through technologies-this policy framework does much to establish electronic access policies and will identify fundamental steps in the development of our respective and integrated action plans.

## Appointment of Eighth Superior Court of Guam Judge

For three years, the Judiciary has sought legislative support to authorize and fund the appointment of an Eighth Judge to the Superior Court of Guam. An additional judge will tackle the Branch's complex caseload and help eliminate backlogs. Having this additional judicial officer will complement and enhance the fulfillment of our core mission – to provide optimal service at the Guam Judicial Center and the Northern Court Satellite – service that is expeditious, effective, and efficient.

## Judiciary of Guam Historic Courthouse Project:

The Judiciary of Guam is seeking out funding to start the process to modernize the Historic Courthouse Building. In 2018, the Old Court Building was added to the National Register of Historic Places. As efforts are underway to renovate the Route 4 Building to relocate the Probation Services Division, the Guam Historic Preservation Trust has committed to work with the Judiciary on the modernization project that would convert the Old Court House into a new Supreme Court of Guam. The project will preserve the historic nature of this building including the unique architectural, mural and stone features of the interior.
