Reminder: Hostisia Award Nominations Due April 4th

(*Hagåtña*, Guam) — Nominations are still open for the Judiciary of Guam's 2025 Hostisia Award. The annual award recognizes a person or organization that has made a significant contribution to improving the administration of justice and good government.

"Every year, as part of its Law Month celebration, the Judiciary honors those who've gone above and beyond to advance the cause of justice," said Chief Justice Robert J. Torres. "These individuals demonstrate a deep and abiding commitment to the rule and role of law, and our island is a better place because of their service."

The selection committee will consider nominees under the following criteria:

- fostered building public support for the judiciary,
- promoted respect for the law and understanding of the judicial system,
- encouraged civic responsibility and service, and
- volunteered time and talents to the court in serving the people of Guam.
