THE DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED TREATMENT COURT PROGRAM

The mission of the Guam DWI Treatment Court is to increase public safety and to improve the quality of life of the participant by providing holistic supervised treatment to reduce recidivism.

DWI TREATMENT COURT

The Judiciary of Guam, Driving While Intoxicated Treatment Court is a judicially supervised treatment program for adults who are charged with Driving While Intoxicated offenses and are facing criminal prosecution. Offenders who qualify under the DWI Treatment Court will be ordered to enter into an intensive treatment program.

The DWI Treatment Court (DWITC) is a four-phase program for adults who are alcohol dependent and who have non-violent offenses. The Office of the Attorney General conducts a legal screening to determine initial eligibility. If found legally eligible, the potential participant meets with their defense counsel to discuss their legal issues and the DWITC as an alternative.

As a DWITC participant, you will have the opportunity for dismissal of your criminal charges upon completion of the program. However, if you fail to complete the program, the judge will enter your guilty plea and sentence you accordingly.



ELIGIBILITY

Program eligibility includes a legal assessment and a clinical assessment.

Legal:

- 18 years of age and older and a legal resident of Guam.
- 3rd DWI felony 3rd offense within 5 years: with property damage (with victim consent) or minor on board.
- 2nd DWI offense
- 1st DWI offense with a blood alcohol content (BAC) of 0.15 and higher.
- No prior or pending felony charges of violent or sex crimes, distribution, manufacturing or intent to distribute controlled substances as noted in 9GCA §67.401(a)

Clinical:

- Impaired Driving Assessment and American Society of Addiction Medicine Screening Assessment.
- Medium to High risk alcohol dependent offenders.
- 👀 Ability to participate in the program.

REQUIREMENTS

- Serve all mandated confinement prior to entering the program
- Attend regular court hearings
- 💦 Attend weekly case management meetings
- 🔀 Attend self-help meetings
- 💦 Complete random alcohol and drug testing
- 😹 Attend individual and family counseling
- Attend weekly group sessions
- 💦 Complete Community service
- 💦 Pay fine
