## Guam Supreme Court Honored with Reporting Excellence Award

(Hagåtña, Guam) Recognizing the commitment to data accuracy and reporting practices, the Supreme Court of Guam was recently honored with the Reporting Excellence Award for Data Submissions from the National Center for State Courts (NSCS). The prestigious award was presented at the December Judicial Council Meeting.

***“Providing accurate, quality data not only guides decision-making, it demonstrates transparency.”*** said Chief Justice Robert J. Torres. ***“Congratulations to our entire Supreme Court team and all who contributed to this worthy award.”***

The Reporting Excellence Award for Data Submissions acknowledges the exceptional leadership and resourcefulness of reporting caseload data.

Since 2015, the Supreme Court of Guam consistently reports publishable caseload data for 100% of the 33 applicable case types covering all categories collected by the Court Statistics Project (CSP). This achievement reflects the determination of the Judiciary and the obligation to improve caseload reporting operations.

***“When I became the data liaison for the Guam Judiciary in 2015, I never imagined we would be rooting for an award but focused on the importance of data and how it should drive the work we do,”*** said Administrator of the Courts Danielle T. Rosete. ***“I would like to thank the Supreme Court team for their unwavering dedication and effort with the CSP submissions and providing statistical reports.”***

The Court Statistics Project is a joint project of the National Center for State Courts and the Conference of State Court Administrators. The CSP publishes caseload data from the courts of the fifty states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico. Data publication serves to distinguish differences in court structure, case definitions, counting practices, court rules, statutes, and terminology.
